Sarsfields Juvenile Hurling Club Code of Good Behavior

The code of good behavior briefly outlines the rules and procedures, which should be observed by young Sarsfields players. Adherence to the code should ensure that each player will enjoy his involvement with Sarsfields Hurling Club.

General Rules

- 1. Mutual respect, courtesy and honesty are required of everyone in the club.
- 2. All Sarsfields players must be registered as members of the club, on an annual basis.
- 3. Sarsfields players must show respect for their teammates, coaches, club officials, parents, guardians, visitors and opponents.
- 4. Sarsfields players must respect club property and should have regard for their own and personal belongings to others.
- 5. Loitering around the outside of the club premises, pavilion and car park so as to cause offense to other members of the public, at any time is forbidden.
- 6. Absolutely no hurling and ball playing is allowed near the pavilion at any time.
- 7. Members are expected to show the highest standards of behaviour at all times. Crude, offensive language or racial comments are not acceptable.
- 8. Bullying of any kind will not be tolerated.
- 9. Sarsfields players act as ambassadors for the club and should behave accordingly on all occasions, especially on away trips.

Playing Code

- 1. Sarsfields players must play at all times by the spirit and rules of hurling.
- 2. The reasons for playing are to improve skills, players are urged to enjoy themselves and have fun.
- 3. All Sarsfields players are required to wear full-face guard hurling helmets at all times. This is compulsory.
- 4. The use of photographic equipment (including picture mobile phones) is not allowed in the dressing room.
- 5. Sarsfields players must practice self-discipline, respect opponents and never argue with referees decisions.
- 6. Be committed but fair and play the ball at all times.
- 7. After the match, shake hands with your opponents, thank the referee, compliment teammates and thank your coaches.
